

During the next 23 months, from December, 1855, to October, 1857, inclusive, after passing shaft No. 1, the progress was 559 metres, equivalent to 24.30 metres, or 79.70 feet per month, at one face. From the north entrance, the progress in 19 months, from June, 1854, to December, 1855, inclusive, when there seems to have been an interruption in the work, was 339.90 metres, equivalent to 17.89 metres, or 58.68 feet per month, at one face. In the last 10 months, from January to October, 1857, inclusive, the progress was 173.20 metres, equivalent to 17.32 metres, or 56.80 feet per month, at one face. We see here, that the work from the north entrance, which was on a down grade where the water followed the advance, progressed much more slowly than that from the south...
